#### ARTICLE 7: OPEB FUNDING

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate and/or transfer from available funds the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) to fund the Town's future obligations for the cost of Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB) identified by the Government Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement 75 Report, or take any other action relative thereto.

#### **ARTICLE 8: GASB 75 AUDIT FUNDS**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate and/or transfer from available funds the sum of Six Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$6,300) for the purpose of funding the GASB 75 Audit for Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB), or take any other action relative thereto.

# ARTICLE 9: INCREASE CLAUSE 41C EXEMPTION

To see if the Town will vote to increase the elderly tax exemption under Chapter 59, section 5, clause 41 C from \$750 to \$1,000.

#### ARTICLE 10: BOARD OF ASSESSORS

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) for the purpose of funding Massachusetts Department of Revenue mandates to the Board of Assessors, or take any other action thereto.

#### ARTICLE 11: CAPITAL PLAN FUNDING

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds the sum of Ninety-Seven Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-Six Dollars (\$97,476) for the following capital expenditures, or take any other action in relation thereto.

- a) Rochester Memorial School Twenty-Six Thousand Seven Hundred Seventy-Six Dollars (\$26,776) to Complete Second Phase of Technology Upgrade
- b) Rochester Memorial School Sixteen Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$16,800) for HVAC Roof Top Air Compressor Replacement
- c) Town Hall Seven Thousand Five Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$7,560) for Final Phase of Basement Waterproofing
- d) Town and Public Safety Sixteen Thousand Five Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$16,550) for Message Board Trailer
- e) Council on Aging Twenty Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-Five Dollars (\$20,475) for a Walk-in Freezer and Refrigerator
- f) Council on Aging Nine Thousand Three Hundred Fifteen Dollars (\$9,315) for Gas Furnace, and Air Conditioning Condenser and Coil

#### **ARTICLE 12: HIGHWAY EXCAVATOR**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate and/or transfer from available funds the sum of Ninety-Nine Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$99,500) for the purchase of an Excavator and related costs, or take any other action relative thereto.

#### **ARTICLE 13: TOWN ELECTION**

To determine whether the Town will vote to move the date of the Annual Town Election to the fourth (4th) Wednesday in May; or take any other action relative thereto.

#### ARTICLE 14: WALNUT PLAIN CONSERVATION PROJECT

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$345,769, to come from any and all other external, non-Town sources such as grants, contracts for reimbursement, gifts or contributions from other towns for the purpose of funding the costs of acquiring a Conservation Restriction over all, or portions, of land associated with the Walnut Plain Conservation Project and described as Rochester Assessors Map 22, Lot 3 and Map 23, Lots 6, 6D and 7 for conservation and passive recreation purposes, said conservation restriction to be conveyed under the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 184, Sections 31-33, and that such land shall be made available to the public for passive recreational use and shall expressly be considered conservation land protected by Article 97 of the Amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to be held in the care, custody and control of the Conservation Commission in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 40, Section 8(c); and to authorize the Board of Selectmen and/or the Conservation Commission to acquire said Conservation Restriction by purchase, gift, or eminent domain and to enter into any and all agreements and execute any and all instruments as may be necessary in the name of the Town to effect such purpose, and as funding therefore to raise and appropriate, transfer or borrow such additional funds as may be necessary for said acquisition including associated project costs. closing costs, legal fees and transfer expenses, and, if borrowing, to authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Board of Selectmen, to borrow any necessary sums pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 44, Sections 7 or 8, or pursuant to any other enabling authority, and to issue bonds or notes of the Town therefore; and to authorize the Board of Selectmen and/or the Conservation Commission to enter into and all agreements and applications deemed necessary for the receipt of funds, grants and/or reimbursements from any and all sources including federal, state, local or private sources including the State Local Acquisitions for Natural Diversity Grant Program (Chapter 132A, Section 11) and/or any other programs in any way connected with the scope of this vote; or to take any action relative thereto. No funds shall be expended pursuant to this vote until the Town has received, been allocated or otherwise secures through grants, contracts for reimbursement, gifts or other external funding, an amount equal to the acquisition cost, including related project costs, closing costs, legal fees and transfer expenses, for said property.

#### ARTICLE 15: ROADS ACCEPTANCE – FORBES ROAD

To see if the Town will vote to accept as a public way known as Forbes Road, as heretofore laid out by the Board of Selectmen and shown on a plan entitled "Road Acceptance Plan of Forbes Road" dated March 10, 2020, and prepared by Bay Colony Group, Inc., a copy of which is on file with the Town Clerk; and further to authorize the Board of Selectmen to acquire, on behalf of the Town, by purchase, gift or eminent domain, any public way and other easements necessary to use said road for all purposes for which public ways are used in the Town of Rochester; or to take any other action relative thereto.

#### ARTICLE 16: ROADS ACCEPTANCE – DOUGLAS CORNER ROAD

To see if the Town will vote to accept as a public way a way known as Douglas Corner Road, as heretofore laid out by the Board of Selectmen and shown on a plan entitled "Roadway Acceptance Plan Douglas Corner Road" dated March 10, 2020, and prepared by Bay Colony Group, Inc., a copy of which is on file with the Town Clerk; and further to authorize the Board of Selectmen to acquire, on behalf of the Town, by purchase, gift or eminent domain, any public way and other easements necessary to use said road for all purposes for which public ways are used in the Town of Rochester; or to take any other action relative thereto.

#### ARTICLE 17: EASEMENT RYDER ROAD/OLD MIDDLEBORO ROAD

To determine whether the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to grant or deed an easement, on terms and conditions acceptable to the Select Board, over a parcel of land owned by the Town along Ryder Road and Old Middleboro Road for the purposes of providing access to **SEABOARD SOLAR HOLDINGS**, **LLC**, and its successors and assigns (collectively "Seaboard"), to and from Seaboard's property in Rochester; or take any other action relative thereto.

This Article authorizes the Select Board to deed an easement over Town land to be used for a portion of the access to a proposed solar site on Old Middleboro Road. The easement is necessary to avoid wetland issues along the roadway. Proposed Easement A Area = 1,587 square feet or 0.036 acres" and Proposed Easement B Area = 3,412 square feet or 0.078 acres

#### ARTICLE 18: PURCHASE OF LAND ROUNSEVILLE ROAD

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to acquire by purchase, to be used for all public purposes, a portion of the parcel of land located on Rounseville Road, shown on Rochester Assessors Map 31 as Parcel 32, which portion contains 2 acres, more or less; to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, and/or borrow a sum of money for the acquisition of said land and costs related thereto; and to enter into any and all agreements and execute any and all instruments to effectuate the foregoing acquisition, provided that the Select Board is authorized to acquire said land only if said acquisition and the costs related thereto do not exceed the sum of One Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$160,000); and to see whether to meet said appropriation, the Treasurer, with the approval of the Board of Selectmen, shall be authorized to borrow the full amount of such appropriation under General Laws Chapter 44 or any other general or special law, and to issue bonds or notes of the Town in connection therewith, or take any other action relative thereto.

#### ARTICLE 19: STABILIZATION FUND

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate and/or transfer from available funds the sum of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000) to be added to the Stabilization Fund, or take any other action relative thereto.

#### **ARTICLE 20: CITIZEN'S PETITION**

To see if the Town of Rochester will vote to transfer from Free Cash, the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) for the purpose of reducing the tax rate.
