To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate and/or transfer from available funds, the sum of Seventy One Thousand Three Hundred and Fifty-Six Dollars (\$71,756) to fund the outstanding Bristol County Agricultural High School Capital Debt for Fiscal Year 2022 as outlined in the settlement agreement dated March 28, 2023, or take any other action in relation thereto.

ARTICLE 23: BRISTOL COUNTY AGRICULTURAL HIGH SCHOOL - FY23 SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate and/or transfer from available funds, the sum of Sixty Five Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty-Seven Dollars (\$65,767) to fund the outstanding Bristol County Agricultural High School Capital Debt for Fiscal Year 2023 as outlined in the settlement agreement dated March 28, 2023, or take any other action in relation thereto.

ARTICLE 24: VETERANS TAX WORK-OFF PROGRAM
